12(1). - (a) In the process of threadbare discussion Mrs. Kalyani Rajguru Mohapatra honourable member representing Class- VII expressed her disappointment about the result in Mathematics in comparison to other subjects. She suggested about the introduction of Vedic Mathematics in lower classes and some more extra classes in higher classes to improve the standard. The same was noted for consideration.
- (b) On the above issue Mr. Pati also clarified the following reasons for low average in mathematics.
- ( i ) Mathematics is not linked with practical unlike other subjects.
  - ( ii ) Students are getting less time to practice.
- (c) In the course of discussion Mr. Pradeep Kumar Nayak, the honourable member representing Class V expressed concern about the opinion of students in respect to out is taught by the teachers is correct. Teachers need to counsel the students that alternative answers are all welcome.
- (d) In order to make the students more attentive Mrs. Rashmirani Upadhyaya, representative of Class –VIII suggested not to keep classes of Mathematics in 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the day. The same was noted.
- (e) With regard to syllabus and examination schedule Mrs. Monalisha Panigrahi representative of UKG suggested to intimate the parents of lower classes, especially LKG & UKG about the date of examination and time table of their wards. The same was not accepted as it will create unnecessary craze and anxiety of examination in the minds of little kids.

- (f) Mr. A.K. Purohit requested the teachers to chalk out the way how the standard of some subjects in which pupils are doing dismal performance will be improved.
- (g) On the issue of future perspective, Mr. Subal Kumar Sahoo stressed about the career development Classes for Class-XI and XII. Adding to the discussion Mr. Manoj Kumar Patro gave importance on CPT classes. He opined, the school should be enrolled/accredited to ICA so that we can get more opportunity to train our students for CPT.
- (h) Mrs. Monalisha Panigrahi suggested to take all Olympiad tests in morning hour only so that the students can concentrate on examination properly. The same was noted for further action.
- (i) Mr. Sashi Ranjan Dash presented an analytical view about the bright performance of DAV Schools, Bhubaneswar in comparison to other DAV Schools across the country. He suggested the school should give more stress on Career perspective rather than giving importance on raising the percentage of any particular subject like math or English. We should give more importance on how students will qualify in NEET, IIT and other competitive examination.
- (j) Mr. Akshaya Kumar Dikhit expressed his grief about the dealings of some new teachers towards the students. He stressed on development of students' behaviour along with the Classroom study. He also requested the old teachers of this institution to train the new ones about their approach and way of dealings towards the students. Taking part in this discussion Dr.Satya Narayan Mishra and Mr.Pradeep Kumar Nayak gave importance on the development of Students' discipline inside the school as well as the outside the campus.
- (k) Members were requested to give their consent in the proforma to be a part of SMC for the session year 2017-18. 5 nos. of consents have been received. All the names will be sent to DAV CMC through Regional Directorate for their approval.
