If we do these things, we can make sure the ocean stays amazing and beautiful for a long time.

Q3. Read the following passage carefully.

Tourists to Jammu and Kashmir have another attraction- the floating post office on the Dal Lake in Srinagar, the first in the country. It is the only one such post office in the world. It is built on an intricately carved maroon houseboat, fastened on the Western edge of the Dal Lake.

The seal used on everything posted from floating post office is unique- along with the date and address, it bears the design of a boatman rowing a shikara on the Dal Lake. The special feature of this post office is that letters posted from here carry a special design which has the picturesque scenery of Dal Lake and Srinagar city. These pictures reach wherever these letters are posted to and hence promote Kashmir as a tourist destination across the world.

This is actually a heritage post office that has existed since British times. It was called Nehru Park Post Office before 2011 but then the chief postmaster John Samuel renamed it as 'Floating Post Office'.

For the locals floating post office is more than an object of fascination. 12 crore is deposited per month in the floating post office by communities living in and around the Dal Lake. The lake has several islets that are home to more than 50,000 people.

The great fear is the recurrence of 2014 like floods in which the houseboat business had to suffer a great loss. Rescue team had to anchor it using special machines in a nearby highland. Then it was brought back on the lake after the water receded. The biggest boon is that at no time of the year you need a fan in this post-office.
